Talked about the importance of addressing concerns with teachers in the proper way as opposed to addressing concerns on social media.

April 7 Meeting

Recognition of Winter Nassau County Champions

Mrs. Haanraadts led the Elementary program review focusing on Board Goals 1 and 3. Goal 1: Social and Emotional Learning and Goal 3: Curriculum Instruction and Technology.

Discussed the Elementary Curricular Goals: Focus on student work to determine needs and next steps, use materials and resources to differentiate instruction in Math and English Language Arts, revise coaching cycles to create predictable support structure, alternating between math and literacy, target professional development on student needs, identify and implement RTI Tier 1 interventions for classroom teachers, and return to proven instructional strategies that may have been adjusted for Covid.

There were presentations in mathematics and literacy.

Discussed a Middle School Competitive Cheerleading Team. In the Middle School cheerleading is currently a club. There are several concerns about making cheerleading a team: physical space for practices, finding a club advisor, it would be \$29,000 to start the program, balancing male and female programs and compliance, and Saturday competitions. Ms. McEntee recommends more analysis because of the financial piece.

The 2022-2023 Budget was adopted.

The Student Advisory Committee is working on parent presentation regarding social media awareness and responsibility. The presentation will take place on April 25th.
